## **Police Lieutenant Graduates from FBI National Academy**

On Friday, December 16, 2016, New Brunswick Police Lieutenant Mark Pappas graduated from the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Academy, 266<sup>th</sup> Session. Lieutenant Pappas was one of 222 law enforcement graduates representing 48 states, the District of Columbia, 20 international countries and three military organizations.

The National Academy is internationally known for its academic excellence, offering advanced instruction in communication, leadership and fitness training for selected officers with proven records of professionalism within their agencies. This session's 10 week program began on October 3 and was held in Quantico, Virginia, just outside Washington, D.C.

Lieutenant Pappas is a 15-year veteran of the New Brunswick Police Department, currently assigned to the department's Criminal Investigation Division as the division's Executive Officer.

Lieutenant Pappas praised the educational experiences the National Academy had to offer.

"The interaction and quality discussions with other law enforcement executives from across the country concerning contemporary law enforcement issues will be extremely beneficial as I continue my supervisory roles at the New Brunswick Police Department," he said. "The vast law enforcement network that I have become a part of will continue to be a valued resource for law enforcement operations here at the New Brunswick Police Department".
